

2020 Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association Fact Sheet

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the State of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state and local coaches' organizations of baseball.

- **Membership:** approximately 1,500 coaches annually.
- **Dues:** \$30 per year due by February 15th (payable to Treasurer)
- **Governing Body:** Twenty-five member Board of Directors with twelve serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTION/EVENTS:

- Annual Convention and Clinic:** Held once per year at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Columbus, OH.
- Board Meetings:** Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Augusta Sportswear Brands All-Star Series, and a meeting in October.
- OHSBCA Website:** www.ohsbca.org
- Augusta Sportswear Brands Senior All-Star Series:** Held one week after the state tournament in June. The series honors eighty (80) graduated seniors and twelve member coaches in a 4 team round-robin format. The event takes place at Bill Davis Stadium on the campus of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.
- State Coaches Poll:** Teams are rated in each of the four divisions five times each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are thirty two (32) voting coaches in each division. Registration and membership forms to vote can be found on website.
- All-State Coaches Poll Team:** The poll coaches in each division select an all-state team. All grade level of players are eligible. Each division selects a Player-of-the-Year and a Coach-of-the-Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are awarded a plaque at the annual convention.
- Player-of-the-Year Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention banquet by **Pukka Headwear**. Each of the four division Player-of-the-

Year recipients will be recognized and one Player-of-the-Year will receive a plaque.

- Field of the Year Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention by **Mar-Co Clay**.
- Field of Need Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention by **Pro's Choice**.
- Hall of Fame:** The HOF induction is the highlight of the awards banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors selects inductees. Nomination forms can be found on website.
- Hank Miller Scholarships:** All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. They are presented during the awards banquet. Form found on website.
- Academic All-Ohio:** Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are handed out at the state convention. Forms can be found on website.
- Service and Victory Awards:** Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and plaques are awarded at the state convention.
- Assistant Coach of the Year Award:** Coaches from each district are recognized as assistant coaches of the year at our annual convention.
- Past Presidents Hall of Fame:** All former OHSBCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon. A reception to follow immediately after the banquet.
- The Consultant** of the OHSBCA regularly attends all meetings of the OHSAA Board of Control in Columbus.


Ray Hamilton | 2020 Hall Of Fame Inductee

Ross High School and Lakota East High School

Ray Hamilton is a 1983 graduate of Lakota High School in West Chester Ohio. Ray was a three-year Varsity starter in football and two-years in baseball. He accepted a football scholarship to Appalachian State University and played one year there. He then traveled west to Independence Community College for a semester before ending up at Missouri Southern State college in Joplin, Missouri for the final two years of eligibility. He graduated in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science degree in education.

Ray began his teaching and coaching career at Ross High School in Hamilton Ohio in 1989. Ray coached football, basketball, and Baseball at Ross. He became Head Baseball coach in 1989 and during that eleven-year span compiled a 197-75 record. They won 5 league championships: 1991, 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1998. Ray was named FAVC Coach of the year in 1991, 1995, 1996 and 1998. He was Cincinnati Enquirer Coach of the Year in 1998.

In 2000 Ray was named Head Baseball Coach at Lakota East High School in Liberty Township, Ohio. During the past twenty years at Lakota East he has a record of 332-189. East has won the Greater Miami Conference 3 times 2005,2010, 2011. His 332 wins are the most in the Districts history. Lakota East has won 3 district final games and have made the regional tournament in 2008, 2011, 2013. They won the state Championship in 2011. He has been selected as Greater Miami Conference Coach of the Year four times: 2005, 2010, 2011, 2019. He was named Cincinnati Enquirer Coach of the year in 2011. Ray coached in the Mizuno All-Star series in 2011 and

the Augusta Sports Wear Series in 2019. Ray coached Junior Team Ohio in the Lonestar classic in 2006 and 2007.

Ray credits his wife for blending baseball with family and making it work for the past thirty-one years. Ray and Dee have lived in Lebanon Ohio for the past twenty-one years.

Tom Neubert | 2020 Hall Of Fame Inductee

St. Francis DeSales

Tom Neubert was born and raised in Lansing, New York where he graduated from Lansing High School in 1992, earning six varsity letters in football and baseball. He then continued his academic and athletic career at Cortland State University (NY) where he was a member of the baseball team from 1993-1996. He compiled a 14-1 record on the mound for the Red Dragons while helping his team to the school's first ever World Series appearance (1996). Coach Neubert was named 1st team All-SUNYAC 3 times, and ECAC pitcher of the year in 1995. After earning his Bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education in 1997, Tom spent three years coaching Division I college baseball at Miami University (1997-1998, 1999) and at Cornell University (1998-1999). While at Miami, Coach Neubert met the love of his life, Jessica.

In 2000, he took a position as the Health and PE teacher at Euclid High School and began his high school coaching career under OHSBCA Hall of Famer, Paul Serra. Coach Neubert got his first baseball head coaching position the following year at Cardington-Lincoln High School where he compiled a 93-61 record from 2002-2007. During his years at Cardington, Coach Neubert served as an assistant football coach as the defensive coordinator under Wayne Hinkle and Matt Stephens. In 2003 he earned his Master's Degree in Educational Psychology from Miami University.

Coach Neubert joined the St. Francis DeSales High School family in the summer of 2007, teaching health and heading up the baseball program. This upcoming spring will be his 13th season as head coach of the Stallions. During his tenure, Coach Neubert has compiled a record of 231-116 (324-177 overall). He was awarded the Central District Coach of the Year in 2008, NFHS State Coach of the Year and Section 2 Midwest Coach of the Year, BCA State Coach of the Year and BCA Upper Midwest Coach of the Year in 2012, as well as the Columbus Dispatch Metro Coach of the Year in 2016. In 12 seasons under Coach Neubert, the Stallions have won 7 Central Catholic League Championships (2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2016, 2018, 2019), 6 Central District Championships (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2016, 2017), 3 Regional Championships (2009, 2011, 2012) and 2 State Championships (2011 and 2012), with an OHSAA tournament record of 41-10 (.804 winning percentage).

Coach Neubert has coached multiple First Team All-Ohio selections over the years including Cardington alum Aaron Landis ('02) and DeSales alums POY Ryan Curl ('08), Thomas Gentile ('09), TJ Alas ('12), Zak DeCamp ('12), Justin Antoncic ('16) and POY Joey Velazquez ('16, '17, '18). 27 of Coach Neubert's former players have gone on to play at the Collegiate level.

Tom has proudly served the OHSBCA and the CDBCA running through the executive board positions in both associations from 2011-2019, serving as the President in 2018. He has been a member of the association since 2000. Coach Neubert continues coaching at St. Francis DeSales High School, where he has also been the Athletic Director since 2010.

Tom and his wife, Jessica Taylor Neubert, will be celebrating their eighteenth wedding anniversary this Sunday. Jessica has been by Tom's side every step of the way assisting, guiding, advising and providing mental therapy throughout his entire coaching career. They currently live in Westerville, OH with their two children, Taylor (senior at SFD) and Ty (7th grade at St. Paul School).

2019 OHSBCA Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship Recipients

Each year the Board of Directors selects several individuals to be awarded our “Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship.” An eligible applicant must be a graduating son or daughter of a coach who has been an OHSBCA member for a minimum of five consecutive years. This year, 12 worthy students have been awarded a \$500.00 scholarship. Hank Miller, Canton McKinley High School, was inducted into the OHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1975. Hank was a teacher of Industrial Arts and Vocational Carpentry for 39 years. He retired from Canton City Schools in 1989. He coached many sports including tennis, golf, basketball and his favorites football and baseball. He was a World War II veteran who served in the Marine

Corps. Hank graduated from Canton Township High School (Canton South) in 1942 and earned his college degree from Ohio Northern University. His coaching career started at Mogadore High School with other coaching stints at Louisville, Canton Lincoln, Canton McKinley and GlenOak High Schools. Hank was a lifetime member of the National Education Association. Hank was President of the OHSBCA in 1982. He officiated basketball and served as recreational director for the city of Louisville. OHSBCA 2020 State Coaches Poll Guidelines

(Please Read and Save) Six times, during the course of the season, starting mid-April the voting coaches of the state coaches poll rank the teams in each of the four divisions and then select 4 divisional All-Ohio teams. This is a recognition of OHSBCA members, their teams and their players. Numbers of voters for each district are selected based upon membership in our state organization.

The voting coaches are scattered throughout the state so that it is the responsibility of each school's coach to promote his team and its players by **contacting these voters before** the voting takes place. (See #7 below.)

1. 32 coaches vote in each division.
2. Coaches must be a member of the OHSBCA to vote, be ranked, or nominate for All-Ohio.
3. Coaches are selected by their district representatives upon completing a voting application.
4. Any head coach who is interested in voting must complete an application and return it to the Poll Director or to his district representative Applications are available on line at www.ohsbca.org starting in May and ending in September each year.
5. The number of coaches voting in a district will vary, determined by the number of OHSBCA member schools in their respective district and division.
6. Coaches selected to vote will be notified by their district reps and their names and emails, with hyperlinks will be published on the website www.ohsbca.org under Poll Teams/ Voters
7. This year's Poll will be conducted for 6 consecutive weeks, ballots to be sent to voters on **April 18, 24, May 1, 8, 15 and 22**. Voting begins at **Noon-Friday, and ends Midnight Saturday**
(Note changes: 6 weeks, Friday, Saturday only)
8. Poll results will be submitted to our website at www.ohsbca.org the following Monday.
9. Coaches selected to vote will receive information on the voting procedures during the 3rd week in March. If you are listed as a voter and have not been contacted by the first week of April, email me so that we may correct any problems.
10. **A 7th ballot, beginning at Noon Thursday May 29 and Ending Midnight Sunday, June 1** will be the All-State, Coaches Poll Team Ballot. Results released when verified by District Reps.
(Note changes: 7th week, Thursday through Sunday)


