2022 Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association Fact Sheet

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the State of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state and local coaches' organizations of baseball.

- **Membership:** approximately 1,500 coaches annually.
- **Dues:** \$30 per year due by March 15th (payable to Treasurer)
- **Governing Body:** Twenty-seven-member board with twelve serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTION/EVENTS:

- Annual Convention and Clinic:** Held once per year in Columbus, Ohio.
- Board Meetings:** Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Augusta Sportswear All-Star Series, and a meeting in October.
- OHSBCA Website:** www.ohsbca.org
- Augusta Sportswear Brands Senior All-Star Series:** Held one week after the state tournament in June. The series honors eighty (80) graduated seniors and twelve member coaches in a 4-team round-robin format. The event takes place at Bill Davis Stadium on the campus of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.
- State Coaches Poll:** Teams are rated in each of the four divisions five times each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are thirty-two (32) voting coaches in each division. Registration and membership forms to vote can be found on website.
- All-State Coaches Poll Team:** The poll coaches in each division select an all-state team. All grade level of players our eligible. Each division selects a Player-of-the-Year and a Coach-of-the-Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are awarded a plaque at the annual convention.
- Player-of-the-Year Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention banquet. Each of the four division Player-of-the-Year recipients will be recognized and one player will receive an award.
- Field of the Year Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention by **Mar-Co Clay**.

- Field of Need Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention by **Pro's Choice**.
- Hall of Fame:** The HOF induction is the highlight of the **Rawlings** Awards Banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors selects inductees. Nomination forms can be found on website.
- Hank Miller Scholarships:** All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. They are presented during the awards banquet. Form found on website.
- Academic All-Ohio:** Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are handed out at the state convention. Forms can be found on website.
- Service and Victory Awards:** Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and plaques are awarded at the state convention.
- Assistant Coach of the Year Award:** Coaches from each district are recognized as **Phoenix Bat** assistant coaches of the year at our annual convention.
- Past Presidents Hall of Fame:** All former OHSBCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon. A reception to follow immediately after the banquet.
- The Consultant** of the OHSBCA regularly attends all meetings of the OHSAA Board of Control in Columbus.

OHSBCA President John Bakalar, Chagrin Falls High School

John Bakalar is the 2021 Ohio High School Baseball Coaches President. He is currently a Teacher and Assistant Varsity Baseball Coach at Chagrin Falls High School. Prior to accepting his new position, he taught at Crestwood Local Schools for the first 13 years of his career and was the Head Varsity Baseball Coach for 11 years (10 seasons) from 2011-2021. While also at Crestwood he served as their Head Freshman Baseball Coach for two seasons (2009-2010) and coached Boys and Girls Basketball at various levels for six seasons. In 2008, he served as JV Assistant Coach at Lakewood High School and began his coaching career as a Freshman Assistant Coach at Cuyahoga Falls in 2007.

During his tenure at Crestwood he led the Red Devils to a .500 or better record in eight of his ten seasons, after the program experienced just two seasons above .500 the previous eleven seasons. Five seasons he won 15+ games, owning a 131-134 career record. Crestwood won a Sectional Championship in 2018 for just the ninth team in program history, advancing to their first District Championship game appearance since 1995. The team broke the school record for best start in program history (10-0) and highest ranking in the State Poll (#2). In 2019, the team won its 10th Sectional Championship in school history.

Coach Bakalar has been a part of the OHSBCA Board of

Directors since 2015, serving as a Northeast District Representative prior to being elected 2nd Vice-President in 2017 and has served as the 2018 All-Ohio Series Director, 2019 Vendor Hall Exhibit and the 2020 State Clinic. In 2021 he will take over as OHSBCA State Poll Director, after serving as a Poll Voter (2014-2021). He served as President of the Northeast Ohio Baseball Coaches Association (2015-2017) and on the Executive Board of the Greater Cleveland Baseball Coaches Association since 2011.

John is a graduate of Lakewood High School (2003). He earned his Bachelor's of Science in Integrated Business Education from Kent State University (2008) and a Master of Arts in K-12 Computer/Technology from Bowling Green State University (2014). Donald R. Jones graduated from Brookfield High School in 1981 and Youngstown State University in 1986. Upon graduation, he began teaching and coaching at Twinsburg High School. He recently retired after 32 years teaching high school social studies.

At Twinsburg, Jones coached both football and basketball for over 25 years and was the Head Baseball Coach for 31 years. After retirement, he coached football at Crestwood City Schools and Gilmour Academy, and currently coaches football and basketball for Kent City Schools. Jones continues to coach baseball at Twinsburg High School as assistant coach to his long time former assistant Jeff Luca.

During his tenure as Head Baseball Coach at Twinsburg, his teams went 427-295 in the very competitive CVC, NOC and Suburban leagues. Jones' teams won seven league championships, 16 sectional championships, three district Championships, two Regional Championships, and made two State "Final Four" appearances. In 1990, his team won the A.P. State Championship. Jones led over 50 players to play in college, and seven to go on to play professionally. He has had 23 All-Ohio Academic Players, three All-Ohio Poll players and three Mizuno All-Ohio players.

Jones was named Coach of the Year seven times, inducted into the NEOBCA Hall of Fame, the Greater Akron Baseball Hall of Fame, the Twinsburg Athletic Hall of Fame, and recognized by the Greater Cleveland Baseball Coaches Association.

Jones attributes success to the mentorship of his late father Reese Jones, support and love of his family, commitment and dedication of his assistant coaches, and strong support from the Twinsburg community.

Waverly High School

Tom Monroe served as the varsity baseball coach at Waverly High School for 26 seasons. Baseball, golf, basketball, softball...he coached a varsity sport for all 30 years while teaching social sciences. His love of baseball and the students there was legendary.

After graduating from Grove City High School in 1968, he attended West Liberty State College where he was a four-year letterman in baseball. He received his graduate degree from Xavier University in 1980.

During his career as varsity baseball coach at Waverly, Coach Monroe amassed 386 wins, three league championships, seven sectional championships, and built a program which produced six All-State players—two with professional contracts. One of those All-State players, Jeff Noble, succeeded Monroe as the varsity baseball coach at Waverly. “I’m proud that Jeff followed me as baseball coach at Waverly. One of us has been at the helm of Waverly baseball for 49 of the last 50 years.” (800 + wins)

He also served as both President and Vice-President of the Southeast District Baseball Coach’s Association. Among his honors, he was selected to the Southeast District Hall of Fame, coach of the year on numerous occasions, and ultimately the Waverly High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016.

Coach Monroe, while largely remembered as the baseball coach, also coached golf for over 20 seasons. During that time, Waverly golf finished 4th and 6th in the State in 1994 and 1995, respectively. He was named coach of the year six times.

Tom and his wife of 47 years, Sandy, still reside in Waverly. They have two sons: Jeff Davis and Jason Monroe and five grandchildren.

Brian Harlamert | 2022 Hall Of Fame Inductee


Coldwater High School

Brian Harlamert is a 1990 graduate of Coldwater High School, and a three-sport athlete who played football, basketball and baseball for the Cavaliers. He attended The University of Dayton on a full baseball scholarship. While at UD he set several offensive records on the diamond, which led him to be inducted to the UD Athletic Hall of Fame in 2013. After college he returned to his alma mater to teach and begin his coaching career.

Brian was hired as part of the Coldwater baseball coaching staff in 1995 as the varsity assistant coach. In 1998, the program was turned over to Harlamert as he became the 4th head coach at Coldwater since 1950. In the past 24 seasons, Harlamert has continued the Coldwater success on the diamond; picking up 2 state titles in 2014 and 2019 to give the Cavaliers 7 baseball state titles.

Of course, state championships are the goal, but not the definition of success of a program. In the 24 seasons under Harlamert, the Cavaliers have won 13 Midwest Athletic (MAC) Conference titles, and Harlamert was selected Coach of the Year for those 13 seasons. Coach Harlamert's teams have won 7 regional titles (2000, 2004, 2008, 2009, 2014, 2018, 2019); 2 state runner-ups in 2004 and 2018, and 2 state titles. Harlamert was named OHSBCA Division 3 Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2015. In 2021, the Cavaliers gave Harlamert his 500th career win, all at Coldwater. He currently has a career coaching record of 511-151.

A baseball program is not one person, but many people and factors working together to achieve the same goals. Brian credits much of the success to the many assistant coaches, summer coaches, community, school administration, fans, his family and all the players who have been a part of the program through the years; as a head coach is only as good as the people he surrounds himself with. That especially holds true to the many assistants in the dugout who

have helped the Cavaliers over the years, including current coaches, Aaron Harlamert, Cory Klenke and his presenter today, Jason Hemmelgarn. Brian also gives many thanks to Hall of Fame coach and legend, Lou Brunswick, for teaching him the game as a player and continues to influence him and the Coldwater program still today.

Brian and his wife Trisha are the proud parents of 4 children: Aaron 24, Olivia 22, Annelise 18 and Evan 16. Brian has had great support at home from his wife, children, and his extended family in Coldwater, including his mother Johanna and his father, Larry who passed away in 2005. His father, Larry, was a huge part of Brian's playing career and early years of coaching. A motto that Brian has followed for many years is "the WE over ME philosophy". Together, we achieve more, and the program is greater than any one individual. Brian's parents, family, friends and many others have instilled in him these philosophies during his playing days and now in his coaching and teaching careers.

- Create and share a Job Responsibilities Chart → creates clear, strengths-based roles, and keeps staff focused on their responsibilities.
- Give your staff opportunities to get in front of the players. These opportunities could be in a classroom, or on-field environment. Gives them reason to prepare & provides ownership stake in the product.

3. **Evaluate** – *“Why guess when you can know...”*

Potential Action Steps:

- Perform an After-Action Review (AAR) to explore what happened, what went right and wrong, and what to do moving forward.
- Provide Areas of Reinforcement & Refinement for each staff member → Track specific strengths & weaknesses. Discuss them consistently with the staff member.

He works with our pitchers and catchers as well as calling the pitches during the game. He has been an integral part of our program success over the past 15 years with his wealth of knowledge, experience, and dedication. Dave is constantly learning by attending clinics, watching videos and relaying the most up to date information to our players. He was inducted into the Central District Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 2008 and served the OHSBCA as the treasurer for the past 20 years. Dave is retired and resides in Grove City with his wife Beth, they have 3 daughters who have blessed them with 5 grandsons.

CENTRAL: David Meikrantz – Dublin Coffman High School

Randy Ward has been a staple to the G-Men baseball program for 7 years. His tireless effort while working on our field has led us to hardly ever canceling games since he has been in the program. He coaches two other sports and has created a number of positive influences on student athletes throughout the school district. He has taken on the job of hitting coach and will not stop molding the baseball team to become the best that each individual can be when getting in the batter's box. 
2021 Season Recap

OHSBCA 2022 State Coaches Poll Guidelines

(Please Read and Save) During the course of the season the voting coaches of the state coaches' poll rank the teams in each of the four divisions and select an All-Ohio team. This is a recognition of OHSBCA members, their teams and their players. Numbers of voters for each district are selected based upon membership in our state organization.

The voting coaches are scattered throughout the state so that it is the responsibility of each school's coach to promote his team and its players by contacting these voters **BEFORE** the voting takes place.

1. 32 coaches vote in each division.
2. Coaches must be a member of the OHSBCA to vote, be ranked, or nominate for All-Ohio.
3. Coaches are selected by their district representatives upon completing a voting application.
4. Any head coach who is interested in voting must complete an application and return it to the Poll Director or to his district representative Applications are available online at www.ohsbca.org starting in May and ending in September each year.
5. The number of coaches voting in a district will vary, determined by the number of OHSBCA member coaches in their respective district and division.
6. Coaches selected to vote will be notified by their district reps and their names & emails, with hyperlinks will be published on the website. (www.ohsbca.org under Poll Teams/ Voters).
7. The Poll will be conducted each week of the season. **Voting begins at Noon – Thursday, and ends Midnight – Saturday.**
8. Poll results will be submitted to our website at www.ohsbca.org.
9. Coaches selected to vote will receive information on the voting procedures prior to the start of the regular season. If you are listed as a voter and have not been contacted by the first week of April, email me so that we may correct the problem.
10. **A final ballot, beginning May 17 and Ending Sunday, May 20** will be the All-State, Coaches Poll Team Ballot.
