

Dear OHSBCA Members,



OHIO HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION FACT SHEET – 2014

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the State of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state and local coaches organizations of baseball.

Membership: approximately 1500 coaches annually.

Dues: \$25 per year due by February 15th (payable to Treasurer)

Governing Body: Twenty-five member Board of Directors with twelve serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTION/EVENTS:

- A. Annual Convention and Clinic: Held once per year at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Columbus, OH
- **B. Board Meetings:** Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Mizuno All-Star Series, and a meeting in October.
- C. OHSBCA Website: www.ohsbca.org
- **D.** Mizuno Senior All-Star Series: Held one week after the state tournament in June. The series honors eighty (80) graduated seniors and twelve member coaches in a 4 team round -robin format. The event takes place at Bill Davis Stadium on the campus of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.
- **E.** State Coaches Poll: Teams are rated in each of the four divisions five times each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are thirty two (32) voting coaches in each division. Registration and membership forms to vote and team discussion forums can be found on web site.
- **F.** All- State Coaches Poll Team: The poll coaches in each division select an all-state team. All grade level of players are eligible. Each division selects a Player –of-the- Year and a Coach-of-the-Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are awarded a plaque at the annual convention.
- **G.** Player -of-the-Year Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention banquet by **Pukka Headware.** Each of the four division Player-of-the-Year recipients will be recognized and one Player-of-the-Year will receive a plaque.
- **H. Hall of Fame:** The HOF induction is the highlight of the awards banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors select inductees. Nomination forms can be found on web site.
- **I.** Scholarships: All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. They are presented during the awards banquet. Form found on web site.
- **J.** Academic All-Ohio: Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are handed out at the following year in October or at the state convention. Forms can be found on web site.
- **K.** Service and Victory Awards: Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and plaques are awarded at the state convention.
- L. Assistant Coach of the Year Award: Coaches from each district are recognized as assistant coaches of the year at our annual convention.
- **M. Team Ohio:** The OHSBCA is a major financial benefactor for Team Ohio. Team Ohio is a team of high school all-stars from Ohio who compete in the Heartland Classic. The Heartland Classic is an eight-state tournament held each year in Norman, Oklahoma, home of Oklahoma University.
- **N. Past Presidents Hall of Fame:** All former OHSBCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon.
- **O.** The Consultant of the OHSBCA regularly attends all meetings of the OHSAA Board of Control in Columbus.
- P. Sponsorships: The OHSBCA is sponsored by many corporations and also help sponsor our scholarship recipients: Rawlings (official baseball- R100 tournament ball and Hall of Fame Banquet Sponsor), Pukka (official cap), Mizuno (Senior All-Star Game Sponsor), Miller Net (official net).

2013 OHSBCA President, Lee Day - Lebanon High School

Lee Day will be ending his year term as President of the OHSBCA at the conclusion of the state clinic. Lee retired from coaching baseball at Lebanon High School at the end of the 2010 season after serving as the Warrior head coach for 29 years. He began teaching and coaching at Lebanon H.S. in 1979 as a varsity assistant in football, sophomore basketball coach and JV baseball coach. He was named the head baseball coach for the 1982 season at the young age of 24 and also served as the head football coach from 1985-87. A 1975 graduate of Edgerton HS in northwest Ohio, Lee went on to play both football and baseball at Ohio Northern University earning his B.A. degree in Math Education in 1979. He earned his M.Ed. from Xavier University in counseling in 1983 and has been a high school guidance counselor since, now completing his 35th year in education. During his baseball coaching career, Day's teams won 352 games with 3 league titles and 2 district runner-up finishes. He served as president of the Miami Valley Baseball Coaches Association 3 years and was named to the Dayton area Hall of Fame in 2000. He is also well known for his basketball

officiating, having officiated now for 34 years. He has been fortunate to work 21 boy's regional tournament games and the OHSAA State Championships 6 years. He was inducted into the Middletown Basketball Officials Hall of Fame in 2006. He and his high school sweetheart, Jodi, have been married for 33+ years having two sons, Trevor and Clint.



2014 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE John Dorner - St. Henry High School



John Dorner graduated from Wapakoneta Senior High School in 1982 and went on to earn his Bachelor's Degree in Education at Bowling Green State University in 1987. He later earned his Master's Degree in Administration from the University of Dayton in 2003.

Coach Dorner began his coaching career while still in college as an undergrad student at BGSU. He coached the Wapakoneta junior varsity squads in 1984 and 1985. He coached the Findlay junior varsity team while student teaching in 1986. Coach Dorner accepted a teaching and junior varsity coaching position at Houston High School in 1987. The following year, he moved to Celina, where he taught from 1988-2000. John was hired as the Head Baseball Coach at St. Henry High School in 1990, during his tenure as a teacher in Celina. His family moved to St. Henry in 2000, where he has been teaching science and coaching baseball ever since. He has also coached 8 years of varsity golf (girls for 7 years & boys for 1 year) and several years of junior high & freshman basketball. John has also officiated high school basketball for 21 years.

2014 marks Coach Dorner's 25th season at the helm of St. Henry Baseball, where he has amassed a record of 428-209. His teams have won 15 sectional titles and 6 district titles. The Redskins have made 6 trips to the regional tournament, under his leadership, and won 3 state titles in all 3 trips to the final four (1999, 2000, and 2003). Dorner's teams have claimed 4 State Poll Championships (1998, 2002, 2003, 2013) and have finished in the Top Ten in the State Coaches Poll a total of 11 times. He has 5 conference championships (MAC) and has reached the twenty victory plateau 8 times (including a 31-2 record in 1999 and a 30-3 record in 2003). He has coached 38 All Ohio Players (27 of which earned First Team Honors). He served as a coach in the 2004 Mizuno All Star Series and has twice been voted as Coach of the Year in the State of Ohio (2002 & 2013). He has been a member of the OHSBCA for 28 years and has been a state poll voter for 20 years. John coached the St. Mary's American Legion Post 323 Baseball Team for 6 years (1988-93), finishing with an overall record of 180-92 and earning 5 trips the American Legion State Tournament. He presently serves on the Acme Baseball Congress Board of Directors.

John has been married to his wife, Brenda, for 22 years. Brenda is an administrative secretary for Celina Schools. They have 2 children. Their daughter, Nora, is a freshman at Wright State University and a 2014 recipient of the Hank Miller Memorial OHSBCA Scholarship Award. Their son, Mitchell, is a junior and an honor student at St. Henry High School, where he plays baseball and golf.





2014 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Ron Janey - Logan High School



After graduating from Ohio University in 1973, Ron Janey began his teaching career at North Gallia High School in 1974. While there for two years, he served as an assistant football coach and basketball coach as well as head baseball coach for two seasons. His baseball teams were Southern Valley Athletic Conference champions both years — the only baseball championships in that school's history. He then went to his high school alma mater, Gallia Academy, for four years. There, he was an assistant football coach all four years and head tennis coach for one year.

In 1980, he then went to his final destination, Logan High School, where he stayed until his retirement in 2013. At LHS, he served as an assistant football coach for 10 years and head baseball coach for 23 years. He also served as Logan's athletic director for his final 23 years. His Logan baseball teams won seven Southeastern Ohio Athletic League championships and, in 2001, made the school's only appearance in a regional tournament. His Chieftains were also ranked in the top 10 of the state coach's poll seven times.

Janey served as a coach for the Mizuno All-Ohio Series in 1983 and 2000 as well as a coach for Team Ohio in Oklahoma in 2000. His overall high school baseball coaching record was 402-193. Ron was also very active in the OHSBCA Association, serving as Southeast District president for many years and on the state board of directors twice. Coach Janey was elected to the Logan High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995, the Southeast District Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 2000, the Ohio Athletic Directors Hall of Fame in 2002, and the Gallia Academy Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

In 1969-70, Ron served his country in Vietnam, where he was a decorated infantry member of the 173rd Airborne Brigade. He was named "Soldier of the Month" in June 1970 while with the 173rd.

Coach Janey has been married for 33 years to Marcie, who is retired from the Logan-Hocking School District as an elementary-school teacher. They are the proud parents of two children: a son, Bo (age 31), is a graduate of the University of Rio Grande and presently serves as a recruiter for the U.S. Army after tours in Iraq and Afghanistan and also served as head baseball coach at Logan for three years; and a daughter, Jackie (29), is presently teaching mathematics at Tri-County Vocational School in Nelsonville, Ohio. She is a graduate of Ohio University and currently resides in Logan with her husband, Jason, and two children, Parry and Pius.

2014 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Jeff Short - Westlake High School



Coach Jeff Short's tenure with the Westlake High School Demons began 27 years ago when he was named the freshman baseball coach in 1986. The next year he moved up to become the junior varsity coach and in 1989, he was named head coach. In 24 seasons as head coach, he compiled an overall record of 345-242 including 20 winning seasons. He was named Southwestern Conference Coach of the Year three times, named The Plain Dealer Coach of the Year twice, was a Greater Cleveland Baseball Coaches Association Coach of the Year and was inducted into the Northeast Ohio Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2010. In May 2013 he received another honor as he was inducted into the Crow's Nest Hall of Fame by the Lake County Captains Baseball organization (Cleveland Indians Class A Affiliate).

During his head coaching career, the Westlake Demons earned four Southwestern Conference championships, made 12 appearances in Districts, earned three regional appearances and in 2012, the team played for the Division I State Baseball Championship. No other team in the

history of Westlake High School has ever made it to the state title game in any sport. The team finished 2012 with a 24-7 record, which are the most wins in school history.

What made the 2012 run to the state championship game even more special was that earlier that year; Coach Short announced that he would be retiring from coaching baseball at the end of the season. He remains a math teacher with the Westlake City Schools where he has taught for the past 28 years.

Coach Short was honored to represent Northeast Ohio as a Mizuno All-Ohio Series Coach in 1996. He was named the Greater Cleveland Baseball Coaches Association All-Star Game coach in 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2002, and has coached several Jacobs Field All-Star games over the years.

Coach Short has been a member of the OHSBCA for 25 years and served on the State Board from 1994-96. He also was a member of the State Coaches Poll.

Seven Westlake High School baseball players have been selected to the Mizuno All-Ohio series teams over the years. More than 50 players have signed on to play college baseball and one player signed a Major League Baseball contract. Former player Chris Holick (Westlake High School Class of 1995) is the current assistant baseball coach at The Ohio State University.

In addition to coaching baseball at Westlake High School, Coach Short has coached boy's junior varsity and varsity boy's basketball. He also was the girl's varsity basketball head coach for three seasons. He continues to stay active with basketball as he currently serves as a basketball official in the Cleveland-area.

His motto for coaching and in life is to "always surround yourself with good people." He is grateful to his coaching staffs over the years for their support and dedication.

Jeff grew up in Archbold, Ohio (near Toledo) before moving to Northeast Ohio upon graduating from the University of Toledo with a degree in elementary education. He also holds a master's degree in Sports Management from Cleveland State University.

He resides in Avon, Ohio with his wife of 20 years, Julie Verba. The couple is the proud parents of a three-year-old son, Jason. You may find Coach Short on a Little League field someday!

2013 O.H.S.B.C.A. HANK MILLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Each year the Board of Directors selects several individuals to be awarded our "Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship". An eligible applicant must be a graduating son or daughter of a coach who has been an OHSBCA member for a minimum of five consecutive years. This year 10 worthy students have been awarded a \$500 scholarship. Hank Miller, Canton McKinley High School, was inducted into the OHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1975. Hank was a teacher of Industrial Arts and Vocational Carpentry for 39 years. He retired from Canton City Schools in 1989. He coached many sports including tennis, golf, basketball, but football and undoubtedly baseball were his favorites.

He was a World War II veteran who served in the Marine Corps. Hank graduated from Canton Township High School (Canton South) in 1942 and earned his college degree from Ohio Northern. His coaching career started at Mogadore High School with coaching stints at Louisville, Canton Lincoln, Canton McKinley, and Glen Oak High Schools. A. THROWING

- 1. Stress accuracy and velocity over quickness.
- Higher you can get the elbow the better chance you have for a more accurate throw. Cut off bottom of arm arc to save time. "L" in arm and hand behind the ball.
- 3. Be aggressive with your glove hand (pull to arm pit)
- 4. Point knee, hip and shoulder in direction of throw.

B. CATCHING

- 1. Hands married and up (show picture window)
- 2. Catch ball in middle of body
- 3. Take ball to shoulder before separating hands as it gets shoulder pointing in throwing direction.
- 4. Catch ball from heel to palm and not in webbing
- 5. Just change of direction, ball never stops.

C. FIELDING - DEVELOP AGGRESSIVENESS

- 1. Creep as pitch is delivered (walk into it). Body in motion stays in motion. Body at rest stays at rest.
- 2. Move in under control (Float like a butterfly).
- 3. Toes out.
- 4. Butt down.
- 5. Thumb out, elbow in (opens glove), 45° angle with glove.
- 6. Field out in front (draw a line from chin to ground and this is where glove should be) out to in, down to up.
- 7. Right hand on top of glove. Helps secure catch and protects face. Put lid on jar.

D. DOUBLE PLAY

- 1. Thoughts
 - a. Key to a defense.
 - b. Keep double play alive, best way to stop a big inning.

- 2. Approach to Bag
 - a. Circle in and get there quickly.
 - b. Shorten up and be under control.

Great hitters rely on the timing of their body to get their hits; poor hitters rely on the timing of the pitch to get their hits (glorified 5 year olds)

Swing efficiency

• the number of clicks from toe touch to swing launch

Body timing

- The body's ability to be in sync with itself
- The timing of the hands back simultaneous with toe touch
- Locking and unlocking body parts in sequence

Creating an efficient swing

Back knee pushes stride foot forward

- Creating a load with positive energy
- Initiating the back side before toe touch
- Controlling the tempo of the load

• How to achieve dynamic balance in the swing

"A DEFENSE FOR EVERY OFFENSE" FIRST AND THIRD SITUATIONAL DEFENSE

Defending against a team with runners on first base and third base is one of the most challenging situations in all of baseball to be in. The offensive team has several options at this point in the inning which could create a great deal of pressure and confusion for an unprepared defensive team. In many cases, the offense wins these battles because teams just aren't prepared or planned out defensively. A coach must have his team primed and alert for what could happen next, you must have "a defense for every offense".

Remember, many times the offense will want to accomplish one of two things: (1) steal a run with the runner from third base, or (2) stay out of the double play by advancing the runner at first base up to second base.

Step 1: Evaluate the game situation

- First question: who is the important out; the "2 Run Rule"
- Speed of runners on base, who is the fastest?
- Type of hitter at plate
- Score and inning of game
- Number of outs and the difference between 2 outs and less than two outs
- Ability and arm strength of the defensive players

Step 2: Determine your defensive strategy

- Coach gives player defensive sign, player relays the play to team
- 2 out scenario
- PLAY 1: THROW THROUGH TO SECOND BASE
- PLAY 2: THROW TO SECOND BASE WITH OPTION TO CUT
- PLAY 3: THROW TO THIRD BASE or FAKE TO SECOND THROW TO THIRD
- PLAY 4: THROW STRAIGHT TO SHORT STOP
- PLAY 5: THROW TO PITCHER
- PLAY 6: EARLY BREAK DEFENSE
- PLAY 7: THIRD TO FIRST MOVE
- PLAY 8: PITCH OUT

Step 3: Execute the defensive play

- Each position has a responsibility eyes up and alert, know where to be/what to do
- Catching and Throwing handle the baseball, errorless
- Communicate runner breaks, being another's eyes, etc.
- Holding runners pitchers time to plate, step off, throw over, verbal alerts, etc.
- Control the rundown one throw, no more than two
- Don't hold the ball that isn't a play, don't show them your weakness

KEYS TO REMEMBER:

- THINK AHEAD
- Get base runner moving at full speed
- Keep the base runner moving back in the direction or the base he came from
- No close plays at the base ahead
- Be aware of the runners distance off third, and listening for your third baseman's alert
- Don't force off balanced throws
- Never throw through with tying and/or winning run on third base
- A great deal of responsibility falls on the "battery" between your pitcher and catcher
- Recommended times to run 1st/3rd offense: 2 outs best time, 1 out is okay, 0 out never






I must congratulate New Middletown Springfield for playing a classic championship game. It was a well played contest that we were fortunate to edge past the Tigers 2-1.



- 8. Poll results will be submitted to our website at <u>www.ohsbca.org</u> beginning April 21st.
- 9. Coaches selected to vote will receive information on the voting procedures during the last week in March. If you are listed as a voter and have not been contacted by the first week of April, email me so that we may correct the problem
- 10. A sixth ballot, beginning May 22nd and Ending Sunday, May 25th will be the All-State, Coaches Poll Team Ballot.


