

2026 Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association Fact Sheet

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the state of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state, and local coaches' organizations of baseball.

- **Membership:** approximately 1,200 coaches annually.
- **Dues:** \$40 per year due by March 15th (NO EXCEPTIONS). Membership runs from Jan. 1st - Dec. 31st. Dual membership NHSBCA.
- **Governing Body:** Twenty-seven member Board of Directors with fourteen serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTIONS/EVENTS:

A. Annual Convention and Clinic: Held once per year at the Hilton Columbus at Easton.

B. Board Meetings: Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Game One All-Star Series and a meeting in October.

C. OHSBCA Website/Social Media: www.ohsbca.org; "X" (Formerly Twitter): @OHSBCAwebmaster

D. Game One All-Star Series: Held usually after the state tournament in June. The series honors players and member coaches. Information on the Series will be posted on the www.ohsbca.org website.

E. Game One Underclass Showcase by PBR: Directed by the OHSBCA and PBR Ohio. Underclass players are nominated and selected to showcase for college coaches. The showcase is held in association with the All-Star Series.

F. State Coaches Poll: Teams are ranked in each of the divisions each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are twenty (20) voting coaches for each division. Registration and membership forms to vote can be found on the website.

G. All-State Coaches Poll Team: The poll coaches in each division rank all-state teams. All grade levels of players should be nominated by their head coach to be eligible and the coach must be a current OHSBCA member. Each division selects a Player of the Year and a Coach of the Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are awarded at the annual convention.

H. Player of the Year Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention by OC Sports. Each of the seven division Players of the Year recipients will be recognized and one Player of the Year will receive an award.

I. Field of the Year Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention by Mar-Co Clay.

J. Field of Need Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention by Pro's Choice.

K. Hall of Fame: The HOF induction is the highlight of the Rawlings Hall of Fame banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors selects inductees. Nomination forms can be found on the website.

L. Hank Miller Scholarships: All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. Form on the website.

M. Academic All-Ohio: Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are sent to head coaches electronically. Forms on the website.

N. Service and Victory Awards: Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and awards are received at the state convention.

O. Assistant Coach of the Year Award: Coaches from each district are recognized as assistant coaches of the year at the annual convention. This award is sponsored by Phoenix Bat.

P. Past Presidents – Hall of Fame: All former OHSBCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon. A reception follows immediately after the banquet.

Tim Broskie | 2026 Hall Of Fame Inductee

Whetstone HS

Tim Broskie, a native of Columbus, Ohio, has dedicated over three decades to shaping young lives through education and athletics. A 1983 graduate of Mifflin High School, he earned varsity letters in football, baseball, wrestling, and swimming. He continued his academic and athletic pursuits at Rio Grande University, where he earned Bachelor of Science degrees in Physical Education (K–12), English (7–12), and Special Education (K–12).

Coach Broskie began his teaching and coaching career in 1989 as a Special Education teacher at Southmoor Middle School, serving until 2004. Concurrently, he was the Varsity Assistant Baseball Coach at Centennial High School. In 1994, he assumed the role of Head Baseball Coach at Whetstone High School, a position he continues to hold.

From 2005 to 2025, he taught students with multiple disabilities at Whetstone, retiring after 36 years of service in Columbus City Schools. He now serves as a Part Time Special Education teacher, continuing his commitment to student success.

Over the course of his career, Coach Broskie has coached high school baseball programs for 37 years, including 32 years as Head Coach at Whetstone. His teams have achieved 574 wins and 252 losses overall, with a league record of 375–45. Under his leadership, Whetstone has secured 18 Columbus City League titles and four runner-up finishes. He is the winningest coach in Columbus City League history and the fifth Columbus City Schools Head Coach inducted into the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Coach Broskie's influence extends beyond the diamond. He has coached high school football for 25 years and wrestling for 10 years and led elite travel baseball teams from 1987 to 2023.

Mark Brunswick was born and raised in Coldwater by his parents Louis and Ann Brunswick and graduated from Coldwater High School in 1984 where he was a part of back to back state titles in 1983 and 1984. He lettered in baseball and basketball and played for his legendary and Hall of Fame father, Lou “Sweet Lou” Brunswick, where he learned invaluable life lessons.

After high school, Mark was drafted by the New York Mets in the third round of the 1984 draft, where he played five years in the organization. Mark learned the game of baseball from the late Davey Johnson and Buddy Harrelson.

Mark then obtained his undergraduate and graduate degree from Wright State University and was fortunate to start his teaching and coaching career at Bellefontaine High School. While a big thank you goes to Marysville and Lehman Catholic for several years of great memories, Mark will always cherish his years at Bellefontaine. Mark also had two ABCA National Fields of Year at Bellefontaine and Marysville, is a member the ABCA National Ranking Committee, and has had several articles published by Inside Pitch and Collegiate Baseball magazines.

Brent Renollet was born and raised in Sherwood, Ohio by his parents Irvin and Mary Lou. He graduated from Fairview High School in 1982 while earning varsity letters in football, basketball and baseball.

Brent continued his academic and athletic career at Defiance College. He earned four letters in basketball and four letters in baseball. Brent was named Male Athlete of the Year in 1986. He was also inducted into the Defiance College Hall of Fame in 2004. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Education. While at DC he coached junior high football at Fairview.

Brent spent his first year out of college as assistant men's basketball coach at Defiance College. He was also Sports Information Director at DC in 1987.

In 1988, he accepted a teaching and coaching position at Delta High School. Brent taught business classes and coached freshmen football, JV basketball and varsity baseball. In his three years, he had a record of 37-28, with one NWOAL title and one Sectional championship.

John Sarver | 2026 Hall Of Fame Inductee

John Sarver began his baseball career playing little league in Akron in 1964. He was captivated by pitching and remembers his father, Ben, sitting on a milkman's delivery box to catch his throws when he was 12. Looking back, those sessions became a training and learning tool and was the beginning of improvement in his self-confidence and his desire to become a better athlete, and later, a coach.

John would go on to play on two Akron Ellet High School district tournament championship teams in 1971 and 1973. That was followed by two years at Valencia Community College in Florida and then two years at Austin Peay State University in Tennessee. A highlight of his college career there included a 5-0 no-hit victory over Western Kentucky on March 26, 1977. He also led the team's pitching staff in 1977 with a 1.76 earned-run average. His two-year career included leading the team with strikeouts, innings pitched, and victories with an ERA of 2.41. That ranked second in school history as of 2020.

After his undergraduate education, he became an industrial arts teacher in the Akron Public Schools and earned a master's degree in education at Kent State University. A 43-year career in baseball coaching followed.

John's coaching record is 627-392. His first season was 1980 at Akron Kenmore High School. He then accepted the head coaching position at the private Akron Archbishop Hoban High from 1981-85 and again from 1988-98. In between, he coached at Akron Buchtel High in 1986 and '87. His tenure at Hoban included four district titles (1981, '83, '85 and '93), one regional championship ('93) and a state runner-up finish (also in '93).

Then he became the head coach at alma mater Ellet from 1999 to 2023, compiling a record of 379-247. At Ellet, in 24 years, he led teams to 18 Akron City Series regular season championships, 15 post-season titles and two sectional titles. A year after his retirement, the Akron Public Schools' Board of Education approved naming the Ellet baseball facility "John Sarver Field."

He coached three pitchers at Hoban High who were drafted by a major league club and played in the minor leagues. One of them, Ken Robinson, reached the major leagues and played for three teams. Two players participated in the state's prestigious All-Ohio yearly event.

John would have 21 players go on to college careers. Five former players went on to become high school head coaches in Ohio.

John's classroom career covered 35 years in Akron, including the last 16 as a middle school science teacher. He retired from teaching in 2015. He also coached football for 42 seasons at Ellet and was a basketball referee for 32 years.

John owes thanks to the many coaches he worked with, especially Dave Sargent, Ben Sarver, Ron Westren, Scott Swan, Bob Shaw, Harvey Haddix, and George "Lefty" Gray. He also appreciates the gratitude and support through the years of hundreds of parents, faculty members, administrators and opposing coaches.

Finally, thanks to his biggest cheerleaders for their support in all his endeavors. John's wife Janis (married 44 years) served as his teams' scorekeeper for more than 20 seasons and also helped his programs in fundraising efforts for uniforms and a scoreboard. They are the parents of daughters Julianne (husband Mark) and Kristin (husband Brian) and their grandchildren Leah, Drew, Logan, Kate and Lauren.

Kevin Yoder is a 1989 graduate of Hiland High School, where he was a four-year letter winner in baseball and also participated in basketball. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Comprehensive Social Studies from Kent State University in 1995 and later completed a Master's degree in Educational Leadership from Salem University in 2015.

Following his graduation from Kent State, Kevin began his teaching and coaching career at Fairless High School, where he taught social studies and coached middle school basketball. In the spring of 1996, he returned to his alma mater as the head baseball coach at Hiland High School. After seven years at Hiland, he accepted the head coaching position at Coshocton High School in the 2002–03 school year, where he led the program for five seasons. In the fall of 2007, he moved to Tri-Valley High School, serving as a social studies teacher and head baseball coach until retiring from coaching after the 2021 season to pursue a career in school administration.

Kevin then returned to Coshocton as athletic director and assistant principal for two years before becoming the athletic director at Perry High School in 2023, a position he proudly holds today.

2026 OHSBCA Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship Recipients

Each year the Board of Directors selects several individuals to be awarded our "Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship." An eligible applicant must be a graduating son or daughter of a coach who has been an OHSBCA member for a minimum of five consecutive years. This year, 22 worthy students have been awarded a scholarship. Hank Miller, Canton McKinley High School, was inducted into the OHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1975. Hank was a teacher of Industrial Arts and Vocational Carpentry for 39 years. He retired from Canton City Schools in 1989. Hank was a lifetime member of the National Education Association. Hank was President of the OHSBCA in 1982. He officiated basketball and served as recreational director for the city of Louisville. Hank is a member of the Greater Canton Amateur Sports Hall of Fame and the Ohio Northern University Athletic Hall of Fame. He was the founder of the Hank Miller High School baseball series.



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
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
